For fiscal year 2020 and later, the annual base budget for full-service community schools is \$2,000,000. This amount must be designated and used for school support staff providing services to students attending full-service community schools. School support staff under this section includes mental health professionals, licensed school counselors, licensed school psychologists, licensed school nurses, and licensed alcohol and chemical dependency counselors.
